16	There presently exists family related cases, i.e., divorces, custody/visitation, etc. that			
17	were initiated prior to the creation of the Family Court Division. These cases were			
18	randomly assigned to all the District Court Departments including those that exist in			
19	General Jurisdiction.			
20				
21	These cases can reach disposition but are subject to motion activity during their lifetime.			
22	Currently, when a family related case, initiated prior to the inception of the Family			
23	Division, is re-opened it is directed to the Department of original designation including			
24	Department's 1, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 within General Jurisdiction. The District Judge of			
25	that Department will then prepare an order transferring the case to the Family Division.			
26				
27	In order to provide a more efficient manner in which to transfer those cases to Family			
28	Division, the following shall be implemented: Upon the re-opening of a family related			

case, the case shall be reassigned to a Family Division Department under the current
guidelines of "One Family-One Judge", if applicable, or randomly reassigned if no other
case or cases exist to the contrary.
