12 ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

13 WHEREAS the judges of the Second Judicial District on March 6, 2007
14 unanimously approved the foregoing policy and procedure for all wireless devices in
15 courtrooms.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered that effective July 1, 2007, the following
17 policy and procedures apply in all Second Judicial District Courtrooms or hearing rooms:


- 18 A. Definitions: Wireless communication devices are electronic devices that are
19 capable of either sending or receiving data such as sounds, text messages, or
20 images. Such devices shall include, but are not limited to, mobile phones,
21 laptop computers, and personal digital assistants (PDAs).
- 22 B. All persons entering the Second Judicial District Court and all items carried by
23 such persons shall be subject to appropriate screening and checking by any
24 security officer of the Court. Entrance to the District Court building will be denied
25 to any person who refuses to cooperate in such screening or checking. This
26 provision is also consistent with the Unified Court Security Policy dated July 26,
27 2006.
- 28 C. All wireless communication devices shall be turned off while in any District
Courtroom or hearing room in this District. Wireless communication devices

may be used in a District courtroom or hearing room with the express permission of the judge or court master presiding in that courtroom or hearing room.

D. Cameras, recording, reproducing, and transmitting equipment which are not part of a wireless communication device as defined in paragraph A above, are prohibited in all District Courthouses unless otherwise authorized by the judges or court masters presiding in that courtroom or hearing room or as permitted by Nevada Supreme Court Rule 230. Failure to abide by this order may result in the forfeiture of any such device.
