JUDICIAL DISTRICT COURT BUILDINGS.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2015-05

WHEREAS, NRS 202.2483(1)(d) prohibits smoking tobacco in any form in government buildings and public places;

WHEREAS, NRS 202.2483(8) provides nothing in state law shall be construed to restrict local control or otherwise prohibit a county, city or town from adopting and enforcing local tobacco control measures that meet or exceed the minimum applicable standards set forth in this section;

WHEREAS, NRS 202.2483(9) requires “No Smoking” signs or the international “No Smoking” symbol to be clearly and conspicuously posted at every entrance in every place where smoking is prohibited;

WHEREAS, smoking is currently prohibited within fifty (50) feet of the entrance to any court facility; and

WHEREAS, the use of vapor devices, such as e-cigarettes, has become common requiring the regulation thereof;



**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:**

1. Smoking and the use of vapor devices, including but not limited to e-cigarettes, is prohibited in and within fifty (50) feet of the entrance to any Second Judicial District Court facility.
2. This Court shall add to the existing “no smoking” signs the following language: “No use of vapor devices, including but not limited to e-cigarettes, within 50 feet from entrance.”
3. This Administrative Order becomes effective immediately;
