## **ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2018-04**

WHEREAS, the Second Judicial District Court Chief Judge has authority to make administrative decisions pertaining to the business of the court (WDCR 2(2), NRS 3.025(2)(c));

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge shall assign cases to each judge in the judicial district (NRS 3.025(2)(a));

WHEREAS, the Second Judicial District Court Family Division (Family Division) consists of 6 judges and 5 masters who hear all matters set forth in Nevada Revised Statutes 3.223;

WHEREAS, since July 1, 2012, the new case filings in the Family Division have increased exponentially;

WHEREAS, the families, citizens, attorneys, and all others who appear before the Family Division are entitled to have their matters heard in a timely, efficient and fair manner;

WHEREAS, the current judicial staffing is insufficient to allow for the high level of service deserved by the parties who appear in the Family Division;

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2017, the Second Judicial District Court Judges unanimously voted to seek two additional Family Division Judges during the 2019 Legislative Session;

WHEREAS, the excessive caseload of the Family Division constitutes exigent circumstances necessitating the Chief Judge to temporarily assign contributory support from General Jurisdiction Division Judges to the Family Division;

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2017, the Second Judicial District Court Judges unanimously voted to authorize the Family Division to develop a plan that would allow the General Jurisdiction Division to provide needed and immediate support to the Family Division;

WHEREAS, on January 19, 2018, the Second Judicial District Court Judges unanimously voted to temporarily pair a General Jurisdiction Division Judge with a Family Division Judge who can provide assistance, as defined between the two judges, as needed and upon request by the Family Division Judge (see attached);

WHEREAS, no Family Division business units or cases shall be transferred due to this pairing;

WHEREAS, Family Division Judges will provide appropriate support and guidance in all areas of family law if needed and as is identified and/or requested by the General Jurisdiction Division Judges through their pairing partnership to accomplish this assistance; and

WHEREAS, all events performed by the General Jurisdiction Division Judge shall be coded to the General Jurisdiction Division Judge to ensure accurate statistical tracking.

## IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. The Chief Judge will temporarily pair a General Jurisdiction Division Judge with a Family Division Judge who can provide assistance, as defined between the two judges, as needed and upon request by the Family Division Judge (see attached);

- 2. Each judicial pair will develop a plan of support to sufficiently provide a high level of service to those parties who are served by the Family Division; and
- 3. This plan will maximize the ability of the Second Judicial District Court to hear matters in a timely and efficient manner as is possible based upon existing judicial resources.

This Administrative Order shall remain in place until further order of the Chief Judge.
