17	[RESUMPTION OF JURY TRIALS – CRIMINAL DOCKET]
18	WHEREAS the Second Judicial District Court ("the District Court") Chief Judge has
19	authority to make administrative decisions pertaining to the business of the court (WDCR 2(2), NRS
20	3.025(2)(c));
21	WHEREAS on March 12, 2020, Governor Steve Sisolak ("Governor Sisolak") issued a
22	Declaration of Emergency in Nevada to facilitate response to the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19)
23	
24	pandemic;
25	WHEREAS as the result of the Declaration of Emergency for COVID-19, Governor Sisolak
26	issued Directives governing activities in Nevada, including a stay at home order, directives limiting
27	the number of persons who can gather, phases for reopening, alternatives to phases, and delegation of
28	reopening to counties;

1	WHEREAS the Declaration of Emergency for COVID-19, and all Directives issued are
2	available at: gov.nv.gov/News/Emergency_Orders/Emergency Orders (last accessed 9/1/2020);
3	WHEREAS on March 16, 2020, Administrative Order ("AO") 2020-02 was entered by Chief
4 5	Judge Scott N. Freeman ("the Chief Judge");
5 6	WHEREAS AO 2020-02 provides, "This order shall be reviewed no later than every 30 days
7	and shall continue until modified or rescinded by a subsequent order." AO 2020-02, p. 4;
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9	WHEREAS on March 18, 2020, the Chief Judge issued AO 2020-05 which temporarily
10	closed the courthouse to the public;
11	WHEREAS on April 9, 2020, AO 2020-02(A) was entered by the Chief Judge;
12	WHEREAS on May 29, 2020, AO 2020-02(B) was entered by the Chief Judge;
13	WHEREAS on June 11, 2020, AO 2020-02(C) was entered by the Chief Judge;
14	WHEREAS on July 24, 2020 AO 2020-02(D) was entered by the Chief Judge; and,
15 16	WHEREAS additional AOs have been issued on other court matters and all AOs entered are
10	available for review at washoecourts.com/Main/AdminOrders (last accessed 9/1/2020).
18	WHEREAS the District Court requested an inspection of the court facilities by the Washoe
19	County Health District ("the WCHD"), which occurred, and was followed by a written report
20	provided to the Chief Judge. The WCHD report delineated necessary cleaning, distancing and
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22	HVAC operation protocols that should be completed and followed for safe return of the public to the
23	courthouse(s) ("the WCHD Protocols").
24	WHEREAS members of the bar were appointed to working groups to investigate, report and
25 26	make recommendations on recommencing criminal and civil jury trials ("the WG
26 27	Recommendations"). These working groups provided the District Court with significant information
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and assisted the District Court in refining its plan for conducting trials and the public's return to the District Court courthouse(s) to serve as jurors and participants in jury trials with public access.

WHEREAS after review and consideration of the WG Recommendations, the District Court established a standing working group, comprised of members of the judiciary and members of the initial working groups, to further address resumption of jury trials ("the Standing Jury Trial WG"). The Standing Jury Trial WG, the District Court bench and Court Administration continued to develop a working plan for conducting in person jury trials during the COVID-19 pandemic.

WHEREAS supplemental jury questionnaires were developed by the Standing Jury Trial WG to include inquiries, as approved by the District Court, related to serving as a juror during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Chief Judge directed the Jury Commissioner to send the supplemental questionnaire to qualified jurors and report the results.

WHEREAS the District Court determined commencement of jury trials should occur on a staged basis. The identified stages, as set forth in AO 2020-02(D) are:

- Jury trials involving criminal charges asserted against in-custody defendants who have invoked their Constitutional rights to a speedy trial.
- Jury trials involving criminal charges asserted against out-of-custody defendants who have invoked their Constitutional rights to a speedy trial.

Jury trials involving criminal charges asserted against in-custody defendants who have waived their Constitutional rights to a speedy trial.

- Jury trials involving criminal charges against out-of-custody defendants who have waived their Constitutional rights to a speedy trial.
 - Jury trials involving civil claims for relief with statutory or rule-based priority.

WHEREAS the Chief Judge intends to enter a separate and subsequent AO applicable to civil matters.

Accordingly, after review, and good cause appearing therefor, this Administrative Order 2020-02(E) follows:

This AO is intended to be consistent with the Declaration of Emergency in Nevada and to effectuate Governor Sisolak's issued Directives resulting from the Declaration of Emergency and subsequent renewals or extensions of said Directives.

This AO is also intended to be consistent with the May 12, 2020, Statement from the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges Regarding Safe Courts and Access to Justice During COVID-19 ("the NCJFCJ Statement")¹ and AO 2020-05(A) which adopted the NCJFCJ Statement's protective guidelines.

This AO is also intended to be consistent with the WCHD Protocols, as updated, which allow the District Court to proceed with a jury trial at 75 Court Street. The original WCHD Protocols are attached as Exhibit 1 to AO 2020-02(D). The updated written protocols will be filed with a subsequent AO.

All provisions of AOs 2020-02, 02(A), 02(B), 02(C) and 02(D), and other AOs, shall remain in full force and effect except as specifically modified or supplemented by this or other subsequent AOs.

Hearings and Settlement Conferences in Criminal Proceedings. Due to the on-going health crisis caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, all scheduled District Court hearings and settlement conferences shall continue to be conducted by alternative means to in-person hearings, or decided on the papers, or rescheduled unless otherwise provided for in AOs or otherwise directed by the Chief Judge. Hearings and settlement conferences in District Court matters shall be held in the discretion of the presiding judge in each department by either conference call or audiovisual platform. All such hearings and settlement conferences shall be conducted in accordance with the Nevada Supreme Court Rules Governing Appearance by Audiovisual Transmission Equipment, Part IX.

Criminal Jury Trials. Based on the responses to the supplemental questionnaires sent to qualified potential jurors, the Chief Judge concludes jury summonses will result in a sufficient number of veniremembers appearing to empanel a jury during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Utilizing the Identified Stages, and pursuant to its inherent authority to control its docket, the District Court created a trial grid² and established trial flights ("TF(s)"). *Maheu v. Eighth Jud. Dist.* Ct., 89 Nev. 214, 217, 510 P.2d 627, 629 (1973). TFs are initially set at four (4) week intervals with the first TF commencing on September 21, 2020.

TFs are currently scheduled to commence:

TF 1 September 21, 2020;

TF 2 October 19, 2020;

TF 3 November 16, 2020;

TF 4 December 14, 2020;

> TF 5 January 11, 2021;

TF 6 February 8, 2021;

1	TF 7 March 8, 2021;
2	TF 8 April 5, 2021;

15	Multiple trials are set in each TF and will be prioritized based on the Identified Stages and
16	other factors, such a length of trial, date of entry of plea, as deemed appropriate by the District Court.
17	Exhibit 1, attached, identifies TF 1 set on September 21, 2020 and TF 2 set on October 19, 2020. The
18	trials within TF 1 and TF 2 are prioritized.
19	Trials with original trial dates set prior to establishment of the TF model for resumption of
20	criminal jury trials and as of the date of this AO, have been assigned to TFs. Exhibit B, attached,
21 22	sets forth those trials assigned to TFs. Trials set after the entry of this AO will be set in a TF by the
23	Jury Commissioner. The District Court will determine prioritization.
24	A brief "Trial Flight Administrative Order" for each TF will issue approximately eight (8)
25	weeks before the scheduled TF identifying the trials set in the TF (by this AO or the Jury
26	Commissioner) and will state the trial prioritization. Approximately, two (2) weeks in advance of
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each TF a motion to confirm docket will be heard by the Chief Judge, or his designee. The motion to confirm docket will be heard by audio/visual platform.

Trials may proceed based on the TF trial priority number. For example, if three (3) trials are set in TF 1, Trial 1 has the opportunity to proceed on the TF date. If Trial 1 does not proceed, for any reason, Trial 2 will proceed. If Trial 2 does not proceed, Trial 3 will proceed, and so on within the TF. By way of further example, if Trial 1 proceeds and completes, the next business day will be designated as a sanitization day. Trial 2 will commence on a business day, as determined by the trial judge, after the sanitization day. If Trial 2 proceeds and completes, Trial 3 will commence on a business day, as determined by the trial judge, following a sanitization day.

If all trials in a TF are not completed during the four (4) week interval, the trials previously designated in the unfinished TF will be moved to the next TF and will be given priority. For example, if TF 1 [9/21/2020], Trial 3 does not proceed and complete in TF 1, Trial 3 will move to TF 2 [10/19/2020], as the first priority trial.

Subpoenas issued for witnesses to appear and testify shall include the TF date and include language the subpoena "continues day by day until the witness' testimony is closed and/or the witness is discharged by the Court." Subpoenas shall also include contact information for the party requesting issuance of the subpoena to provide information to the witness regarding a more specific date and time for the witness' appearance in order for the witness to comply with his or her duty to appear and testify under the continuing subpoena.

For trials that have not been set as of the date of entry of this AO but require setting after a defendant pleads not guilty to criminal charges, the District Judge will direct counsel to set the trial with the Jury Commissioner. Utilizing the Identified Stages, the Jury Commissioner will set each trial on a future TF.

For all trials set in TFs, the Judicial Department in which the case is assigned will rule on all pre-trial matters. All motions must be fully brief and submitted not later than twenty-eight (28) days before the TF unless an earlier date is ordered by the assigned Judicial Department. *See generally*, LCR 7. Decisions on the submitted motions will be entered fourteen (14) days prior to TF. The Chief Judge will determine whether the trial will proceed before the assigned Judicial Department, or an alternate Judicial Department, in order to facilitate and maximize the number of trials that may be resumed during the pandemic.

The District Court understands some cases may be ready for trial and have not been designated to a TF due to Identified Stages priority. After December 31, 2020, the District Court will consider requests to add a trial to a TF. Any such request must be based on filed stipulation with a proposed order served on the assigned Judicial Department, the Jury Commissioner and the Chief Judge.

After December 31, 2020, the Chief Judge will consider requests for a date certain for a trial within a TF. A process for such requests will be addressed in a subsequent AO.

<u>Review of Trial Flight Model</u>. The TF model has been established during the COVID-19 pandemic to accommodate the resumption of jury trials and is a temporary measure. The Chief Judge, the District Court, Court Administration and the Standing Jury Trial WG will set a time for review of the TF model, and specifically, the four (4) week intervals.

<u>Place of Trial</u>. The Standing Jury Trial WG, the District Court and Court Administration investigated alternative venues to accommodate recommendations of the WCHD Protocols for the specific venue which may be less restrictive than those promulgated for the 75 Court Street courthouse.

As stated, the TF 1 is set for September 21, 2020. Initially, one trial will be conducted at 75 Court Street, or such other place the Chief Judge may designate, until the Chief Judge determines more than one jury trial can proceed at a time.

All trials heard will be conducted in accordance with the most current WCHD Protocols in effect for the courthouse or alternate venue. The District Court is in the process of completing the Second Judicial District Court Jury Trial COVID-19 Protocols with which all participants must comply during all trials in order to reduce the risk of COVID-19 spread to the extent possible.

Any delay in trial, as a result of this or prior AOs, shall be excluded for purposes of calculating speedy trial under NRS 178.556(1) and NRS 174.512. The District Court is actively planning and proceeding with commencement of jury trials, however, the ends of justice and public health concerns are best served by taking actions necessary to stage the commencement to accommodate circumstances resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. Ultimately, these concerns outweigh the interests of the parties and the public in a speedy trial. "As stated in *State v. Squier*, 56 Nev. 386, 403, 54 P.2d 227, 234 [overruled on other grounds]: 'a defendant cannot require of the trial court that it disregard the condition of its calendar, the pendency of other cases, public expense, and the convenience or health of judge, court officers, and jurors.'" *Application of Hansen*, 79 Nev. 492, 495, 387 P.2d 659, 660 (1963).

Case types identified as "essential" in the Administrative Order 2020-02 continue to have priority in the District Court, together with the Identified Stages. Case-by-case exceptions may be ordered at the discretion of the Chief Judge.

Any time periods identified in AO 2020-02, 02(A), 02(B), 02(C) and 02(D) are extended for an additional thirty (30) days from the date of this Administrative Order 2020-02(E), except as specifically stated herein or provided in another AO, i.e. AO 2020-09 [Dependency Matters].
