ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-08

WHEREAS, the Second Judicial District Court ("Court") Chief Judge has authority to make administrative decisions pertaining to the business of the Court (WDCR 2(2), NRS 3.025(2)(C));

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Governor Steve Sisolak declared a state of emergency in Nevada in response to the recent outbreak of the 2019 Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) and requested all Nevadans stay home to implement social distancing;

WHEREAS, Administrative Order 2020-05 responded to the Governor's directive by temporarily closing the Second Judicial District Court to in-person public access to the physical courthouse locations;

WHEREAS, Public access to the Court record continues to be available including requests for certified copies of public Court documents;

WHEREAS, To promote timely and efficient access to the Court while providing safety to the public and employees, the Court approved procedures for electronically certifying copies of Court documents;

WHEREAS, Public access to filing and initiating Court cases continues to be available including the request for issuance of summons, citations, letters testamentary, and other documents;

WHEREAS, To promote timely and efficient access to the Court while providing safety to the public and employees, the Court approved procedures for electronically issuing Court documents;

NOW THEREFORE, effective immediately:

- 1. The Second Judicial District Court will follow the approved procedures for electronically certifying copies of Court documents.
- 2. The Second Judicial District Court will follow the approved procedures for electronically issuing Court documents.
- 3. All electronically certified Court documents shall be considered a true, full and correct copy of the original record on file with the Court.
- 4. No person or entity shall refuse an electronically certified Court document as a true, full and correct copy of the original on file with the Court.
- 5. No person or entity shall refuse an electronically issued Court document including summons, citations, and letters testamentary.
