WHEREAS the Chief Judge finds it appropriate the SJDC remain open to adjudicate emergency election disputes, if any, during the 2022 primary election on June 14, 2022;

WHEREAS as in prior elections, a designated Election Judge to hear emergency election disputes is an efficient method of resolving any such disputes; and

Accordingly, after review, and good cause appearing, this Administrative Order 2022-07 ("AO") follows:

1. The Clerk of Court shall open the SJDC at 7:00 a.m. on June 14, 2022, and remain open for document filing and processing until thirty (30) minutes after the last voter has been reported in Washoe County;

2. During the extended hours addressed in this AO, on June 14, 2022, the Clerk of Court shall only accept filings related to the 2022 primary election. Filings may be accepted electronically, including in person assisted electronic filing, at 75 Court Street, Reno, Nevada 89501;

3. The Honorable Scott N. Freeman is appointed to serve as the Election Judge;

4. If a matter regarding the primary election is heard, the matter will be clerked by an assigned courtroom clerk and reported by a court reporter selected by the Election Judge. The JAVS recording system may be utilized in the place of a court reporter;

5. Any emergency election matters may be heard using the Zoom platform at the discretion of the Election Judge;

All matters shall be heard by the Election Judge on the record;

6.

7. No ex parte communications will be entertained by the Election Judge absent extraordinary exigent circumstances; 8. The Election Judge will preside over all election contests filed from the date of entry of this Order to the day after the last date any election on the 2022 primary election ballot is certified; and 9. This Administrative Order shall be in effect until specifically modified or rescinded by subsequent administrative order. IT IS SO ORDERED. DATED this 6th day of June, 2022. LYNNE K.
