13	ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2022-11 GRANTING THE WASHOE COUNTY SHERIFF EARLY RELEASE AUTHORITY
14	
15	WHEREAS pursuant to NRS 211.240, the Washoe County Sheriff submitted his
16	application to the Chief Judge of the Second Judicial District Court requesting authority
17	to release certain inmates who meet the requirements of NRS 211.240 ("Application");
18	WHEREAS Section 211.240 of the Nevada Revised Statutes provides, in
19	pertinent part:
20	Early release of prisoners to relieve overcrowding.
21	***
22	2. In a county in which there is not a city jail, the sheriff may
23	apply to the chief judge of the judicial district for authority to release prisoners Upon receipt of such an application, the chief judge shall
24	consult with a justice of the peace designated by the justices of the peace for the county and a judge designated by the municipal courts for the
25	county. After the consultation, the chief judge may enter an order

consistent with the provisions of this section granting authority to release 1 prisoners in the manner set forth in the order. The duration of this 2 authority, if granted, must not exceed 30 days. 3. At any time within the duration of an authority granted when 3 the number of prisoners exceeds the operational capacity of the jail, the sheriff or other officer in charge may release the lesser of: 4 (a) The number of prisoners eligible under this section; or (b) The difference between the number of prisoners and the 5 operational capacity of the jail. 6 4. A prisoner is eligible for release only if the prisoner: (a) Has served at least 75 percent of his or her sentence; 7 (b) Is not serving a sentence for a crime for which a mandatory sentence is required by statute; 8 (c) Is not serving a sentence for a crime which involved an act of violence; and 9 (d) Does not pose a danger to the community. 10 Among prisoners eligible, priority must be given to those 5. whose expiration of sentence or other release is closest. 11 A prisoner released pursuant to this section may be 6. required to remain on residential confinement for the remainder of his or 12 her sentence or may be required to participate in another alternative program of supervision. 13 7. As used in this section, "operational capacity" means the number of prisoners that may be safely housed in a jail in compliance with 14 the regulations governing the sanitation, healthfulness, cleanliness and 15 safety of the jail that are adopted by the State Board of Health pursuant to NRS 444.335. 16 NRS 211.240; 17 WHEREAS the Application states the Washoe County Detention Facility has 18 19 exceeded its operational capacity as defined by NRS 211.240(7); and, 20 WHEREAS pursuant to NRS 211.240(2), the undersigned Chief Judge of the 21 Second Judicial District Court ("SJDC") consulted with Judge Timothy Graham, Gerlach 22 Justice Court, Chief Judge Kevin Higgins, Sparks Justice Court, Chief Judge Shelly 23 O'Neill, Reno Municipal Court, Chief Judge Scott Pearson, Reno Justice Court, Chief 24 25 26 AO 2022-11 2 27

Judge James Spoo, Sparks Municipal Court, and Judge Alan Tiras, Incline Justice Court, regarding the Application via electronic mail. The Application was not opposed.

WHEREAS the Chief Judge also placed the Washoe County Sheriff's Application on the agenda for the next SJDC Judges' meeting. The SJDC bench declined to approve the Application for persons serving sentences for gross misdemeanors.

WHEREAS the Chief Judge received notification as of July 19, 2022, the Washoe County Detention Facility has exceeded its operational capacity as defined by NRS 211.240(7); and,

Good cause appearing therefor,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. To relieve overcrowding, the Washoe County Sheriff is granted authority to release the lesser of (a) the number of inmates who qualify for early release under NRS 211.240(4)-(5), or (b) the difference between the number of inmates and the operational capacity of the Washoe County Detention Facility, for persons serving sentences for misdemeanors.

2. The Washoe County Sheriff shall not release, by early release authority, inmates held on Division of Parole and Probation holds.

3. The Washoe County Sheriff shall not release, by early release authority, inmates held on or serving sentences on charges <u>related</u> to homicide, sexual offenses, violation of protective orders, domestic violence offenses, weapons offenses, and felony DUI offenses. And,

2	thirty (30) days from the date of this Administrative Order.
