There are strict timing requirements for filing peremptory challenges:

A peremptory challenge must be filed within 10 days of the parties being notified that a trial or hearing date has been set or not less than 3 days before the date set for the hearing of any contested pretrial matter, whichever comes first.

If a case is not assigned to a judge before the time required for filing the peremptory challenge, the challenge must be filed within 3 days after the party or their attorney is notified that the case has been assigned to a judge or before the jury is sworn, evidence is taken, or any ruling made in the trial or hearing, whichever comes first.

It is your responsibility to know whether you can still successfully file a peremptory challenge.

A new judge will be randomly assigned to your case; you do not get to pick who the new judge is.
