SUBJECT: Presumptive Maximum Amounts of Child Support

Pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 125B.070, the presumptive maximum amounts of child support have been adjusted for the period beginning July 1, 2017.

The Consumer Price Index (all items) published by the U.S. Department of Labor for calendar year 2017 <u>increased 2.1 percent</u>; therefore, the presumptive maximum amounts originally established and modified annually pursuant to NRS 125B.070 will increase 2.1 percent effective July 1, 2017. The following chart describes the presumptive maximum amounts for the period July 1, 2017, through June 30, 2018:
